Our Sunday night event is going to be quite unique. We are planning a Gala Masquerade Dinner at Generations Hall, a historic warehouse converted event facility, located a short walk from the Hilton Hotel. The evening will feature **Dr. Tim Craig**, whose talk is entitled “An Overview of the Exercise Induced Bronchospasm Landmark Survey.” Also speaking is **Mr. Ned Goldberg** who is the Executive Director of New Orleans Jewish Children’s Regional Service. Ned will talk about the Jewish community in New Orleans and provide a perspective of how the Jewish community and the New Orleans community as a whole have coped post-Katrina. The **New Orleans Klezmer All-Star Band** will play traditional klezmer music as well as some good old New Orleans jazz. This past year, AFI was honored to be invited to give a Sister Symposium at the World Allergy Organization held in Argentina. The subject of our symposium was, “The Environmental Impact of Air Pollution on Non-Allergic Respiratory Disorders.” AFI also sponsored a program followed by a reception for our South American colleagues and AFI members attending the WAO at Argentina’s oldest synagogue, known as Libertad Temple. This event was very well attended and hopefully will be the first of many AFI sponsored outreach programs to our allergy colleagues at international meetings. I want to give special thanks to **Edgardo Jares** who without his efforts this event would not have been possible.

This past year AFI has awarded three additional research grants totaling \$9,000. Congratulations to **Arnon Broides** (Role of Bruton Tyrosine Kinase and Leflunomide Metabolite Analog (LFM-A13), on Neutrophil Functions in Patients with X Linked Agammaglobulinemia), **Ariel Munitz** (Role of Esophageal Epithelial Cell Related Cell Surface Receptors in the Pathogenesis of Eosinophilic Esophagitis) and **Miguel Stein** (The Prevalence and Long Term Follow-up of Eosinophilic Esophagitis in Israel, a Retrospective Pathology Based Analysis). Although these research awards are relatively modest at this juncture in the short history of our organization, we must remember that a spark can light a fire. We expect great things to come from these researchers.

We continue to support Mini-fellowship programs. **Dr. Eduardo Shahar**, who immigrated from Argentina to Israel in 1989 and is currently a faculty member at the Institute of Allergy, Clinical Immunology & AIDS on the Rambam Health Care Campus, in Haifa will attend this year’s AAAAI meeting followed by a three week mini-fellowship at the University of Cincinnati and Children’s Hospital. We welcome other institutions to participate in this mini-fellowship program. Please contact me at jonathan.bernstein@uc.edu if you are interested in being a host institution.

To date, AFI has provided over \$70,000 to fund research and educational grants as well as sponsoring professional meetings all in keeping with our mission which is to join together with our Israeli Allergy colleagues to foster education and research activities in our specialty. We are very fortunate to have a great corporate sponsor of AFI in TEVA pharmaceuticals. Their support not only allows our organization to hold annual events at the national allergy meetings but also to fulfill our mission. Special thanks to Greg Lund, Mark Salyer and the entire TEVA group for their enduring commitment to AFI.

However, AFI programming would not be possible without the support of our members. This meeting is our big fundraiser not unlike Yom Kippur. We hope that you feel as strongly as we do about the value AFI brings to our professional community. 



Dr. Timothy Craig

AFI is pleased to have Dr. Timothy Craig as the speaker for our 2010 Annual Dinner Event. Dr. Craig will speak on "An Overview of the Exercise Induced Bronchospasm Landmark Survey."

Dr. Timothy Craig is Professor of Medicine and Pediatrics in the Division of Pulmonary, Allergy, and Critical Care Medicine at the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine. He is board-certified in Allergy and Immunology, a Fellow in both the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology (AAAAI) and the American College of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology (ACAAI). Dr. Craig is Chair of the Allergy, Asthma and Immunology Section, Director of Allergy and Asthma Clinical Research and Program Director for the Allergy Asthma and Immunology Training Program at Penn State's Hershey Medical Center. He is past Governor of the Regional, State and Local Allergy Associations for the Middle Atlantic States, Past President of the PA Allergy Association, on the Board of Directors for the American College of Allergy Asthma and Immunology and has been nominated as Interest Section Chair for the American Academy of Allergy Asthma and Immunology.

Dr. Craig's primary professional interest is to provide a comprehensive program for immunology, allergic diseases and respiratory illnesses via his (1) research program, (2) education of medical students, residents, healthcare providers, and subjects, (3) Allergy and Immunology Clinic that provides state-of-the-art care for patients with asthma and other allergic and immune-mediated diseases and (4) the Allergy, Asthma and Immunology Training Program to educate asthma and immunology specialists. He has been a co-investigator for the ACRN DCC since 1995 and the CARE Network from 1999–2004. His current research projects include participation in Phase II and III clinical trials on asthma medications, such as biologic immunomodulators, leukotriene inhibitors, phosphodiesterase inhibitors, anti-cholinergics, beta-agonists, and new corticosteroids. He is also active in Investigator Initiated Research on asthma, sleep, COPD, Hereditary Angioedema and rhinitis. Dr. Craig has published multiple articles on his investigations into drug therapies for asthma, the effects of allergic rhinitis on sleep-disordered breathing, and Hereditary Angioedema.

Bernard B. Siegel Memorial Award

Dr. Bernard B. Siegel was a long-standing Fellow of the AAAAI, Editor of the *Allergy Abstracts of the Journal of Allergy and Clinical Immunology* and recipient of the Distinguished Service Award of the Academy. Dr. Siegel was very interested in medical affairs in Israel, particularly in the field of allergy. After his death in October 1982, family and friends established a fund in his memory.

Since 1985 a leading Israeli Allergist/Immunologist and author of a paper accepted for presentation at the American Academy's annual meeting has received the Bernard B. Siegel Memorial Award. The 2010 recipient of this prestigious award is **Michal Cohen, M.D.** She is the senior author of the paper

"The Incidence, Manifestations and Natural Course of Neonatal Rectal Bleeding in Relation to Cows' Milk Feeding," which will be presented in New Orleans.

Dr. Cohen graduated magna cum laude and received a B.Sc. in Biology from the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. She attended Hadassah School of Medicine in Jerusalem and served an internship at the Ha'Emek Medical Center in Afula. She was an outstanding resident in Pediatrics at the Assaf Harofeh Medical Center in Zerifin which is affiliated with the Sackler School of Medicine, Tel Aviv University.

Allergists for Israel wishes to applaud Dr. Michal Cohen for her impressive accomplishments and wishes her continued success.

Do you ever feel overwhelmed that the task at hand is just too great to tackle? The “to do” pile seems to swell as the resources seem to shrink. It is all too inviting to hide away, at least for a short time.

Usually our burden pails in view of the global task at hand at any given moment. There is never a lull in the action to have the luxury of time, to hide away. Mona Iancovici Kidon, M.D.

A cum laude graduate of the Faculty of Medicine at the Technion, Israel's Institute of Technology, **Dr. Kidon** is an American Board of Pediatrics certified pediatrician. She completed her fellowship in Allergy and the Clinical Immunology at the Kaplan Medical Center in Rehovot, Israel. She is senior physician in the Allergy Immunology Unit, Sheba Medical Center in Tel Hashomer. She serves as a consultant in Allergy and Immunology to numerous institutions, including the Department of Pediatric Medicine, KK Children's Hospital in Singapore.

Dr. Kidon is a member of numerous professional organizations including the Israeli Medical Association, American Academy of Pediatrics, Israeli Association of Allergy and Clinical Immunology, the European Network

of Drug Allergy, American Academy of Asthma, Allergy and Immunology, the European Society of Immune Deficiencies, the Singapore Society of Allergy and Immunology, and Vice Chair of the Africa and Middle East section of the AAAAI International Assembly.

Dr. Kidon is an experienced lecturer both in Israel and abroad, with interests in the fields of environmental and genetic determinants of atopic disease and asthma, allergen characterization as well as drug hypersensitivity reactions. Her publications reflect this broad spectrum of interests.

Mona's tireless efforts, hard work and dedication to high achievement were fundamental to the success of the first IAACI-ACAAI joint conference that took place in Jerusalem, Israel in December of 2008.

Menachem Rottem, MD, is Head of the Allergy Asthma and Immunology Service at the Emek Medical Center, Afula, and Senior Clinical Lecturer at the Rappaport Faculty of Medicine of the Technion in Haifa. A graduate of the Hebrew University Hadassah Medical School in Jerusalem, Dr. Rottem completed a residency in Pediatrics at Hadassah University Medical Center and an Allergy Immunology Fellowship at the Children Hospital of Philadelphia University of Pennsylvania Medical School. He completed a second Fellowship in Allergy and Immunology as a Clinical Associate at the Laboratory of Clinical Investigation (LCI), National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). He later returned as a visiting scientist to work at the Laboratory of Allergy at the NIAID/NIH.

Dr. Rottem is the past Chairman of the Israeli Association of Allergy and Clinical Immunology (IAACI). He serves as Chair of the International Assembly of the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology (AAAAI) and member of AAAAI committees including Mast Cell Disorder Task Force, Practice, Diagnostics and Therapeutics Committee, Sports Medicine Committee, and Immunotherapy and Diagnostics Committee. Dr. Rottem is Chair of the Sub-Committee on Allergy Prevalence and Migration, World Allergy Organization (WAO), and was a member of the World Allergy Congress (WAC) Scientific Program Committee.

Menachem's dedication to the advancement of professionalism, education and research within Allergy and Immunology helped lead the way towards the realization of a joint IAACI-ACAAI Israeli Conference in 2008.

Israeli Recipients of AFI Grants

He stated that AFI was pleased to participate in the conference by providing support for **Dr. Amy Pallar** who spoke on Atopic Dermatitis as well as awarding the three research awards in Basic/Translational and Clinical research.

Bernstein applauded the three recipients as well as acknowledging all nine submissions.

"They, (the research submissions), were all very competitive. We encourage everyone to continue to submit proposals next year." In 2009, AFI was also able to support two mini-fellowships in Cincinnati, Ohio. **Dr. Evgenia Baraban** and **Dr. David Nusem** were the recipients.

"We will continue to fund mini-fellowships and hope to expand them to more institutions. I must say that working with the IAACI leadership and developing friendships with its members has been a very gratifying experience for me and my fellow AFI colleagues," Bernstein stated. "We pledge to continue to fulfill the mission of AFI which is to promote and support academic and research opportunities in the field of Allergy and Immunology in Israel and to develop camaraderie between Israeli allergists and allergists around the world!"


